Minutes of Meeting January 24, 2024

The Stafford County Board of County Commissioners met on Wednesday, January 24, 2024, in the Commission Room in the Annex. Commissioner Wycoff called the meeting to order at 8:30 a.m. Present: Todd Wycoff, Jim Stanford, and Bryce Garner.

Phillip Nusser, Road & Bridge, met with the commissioners to discuss the billing & accounts receivable process for the road department. The commissioners advised that they are just wanting to make sure receivables are staying current and the process is working. There was also discussion regarding equipment that needs to be disposed of. A list will be compiled and then the method of disposition will be decided on. Future equipment and machinery needs were also discussed.

Vanessa Cornwell, Treasurer, advised that the proceeds from the last tax sale have finally been received. She presented the tax roll corrections to abate the remaining taxes on those properties. Commissioner Garner moved, and Commissioner Stanford seconded, to approve these tax roll corrections along with the other miscellaneous tax roll corrections. Motion carried 3-0.

Vanessa also presented the employee evaluations for her department. Commissioner Garner moved, and Commissioner Stanford seconded, to recess to executive session for 15 minutes pursuant to the non-elected personnel exception to discuss non-elected personnel. Motion carried 3-0. In at 9:24 a.m. Out at 9:31 a.m.

Commissioner Garner moved, and Commissioner Stanford seconded, to accept the minutes from the January 17th session. Motion carried 3-0.

Commissioner Garner moved, and Commissioner Stanford seconded, to adopt Resolution 2024-4 authorizing participation in the Rural Opportunity Zone student loan repayment program for 2024. Motion carried 3-0.

Carl Miller, Appraiser, presented his employee evaluations. Commissioner Garner moved, and Commissioner Stanford seconded, to recess to executive session for 15 minutes pursuant to the non-elected personnel exception to discuss non-elected personnel. Motion carried 3-0. In at 9:50 a.m. Out at 10:00 a.m. Carl also advised that Stafford County is one of eleven counties that has not yet received their 2024 agricultural use values. This impacts several farmsteads, parcels, feedlots, etc. March 1st is the deadline to have value estimates sent out to taxpayers. As a result of this delay, Carl will be asking for a 30-day extension to get these value estimates out.
