

**Stafford County Commissioners  
Minutes of Meeting  
May 27<sup>th</sup>, 2020**

The Stafford County Board of County Commissioners met in regular session in the commission room in the courthouse on Wednesday, May 27th, 2020. Chairman Fairchild called the meeting to order at 8:30 a.m. Present: Kurt Fairchild, Clayton Grimmatt and Todd Wycoff. Julie Lyon was present.

Ryan Witt presented 2021 budgets for the noxious weed and the environmental services departments. The noxious weed budget decreased from \$111,100.00 in 2020 to \$ 92,750.00 for 2021. Environmental services budget remained the same, coming in at \$ 7,600.00.

Commissioner Wycoff moved and Grimmatt seconded to approve the minutes of the May 20<sup>th</sup> session. Motion carried 3-0.

Carolyn Dunn and Hannah Ward met with the board to discuss the CDBG-CV Community Improvement application. At 9:00 a.m., Commission Chairman Fairchild recessed the regular session for the public hearing on the application. There were no citizens present. Commissioner Grimmatt moved and Wycoff seconded to sign the residential anti-displacement and relocation assistance plan. Motion carried 3-0. Documents were signed to proceed with the application. The meeting reconvened at 9:15 a.m. The housing project at 8<sup>th</sup> and Broadway in St. John was discussed. Dunn received word that funding through Kansas Housing Resources Corp. has been secured for three projects in St. John and one in Hudson. A Zoom meeting was held with Jake Ferrell, ASM Consultants on the intermodal project that is being explored. Cost estimates ranged from 6.1 million dollars to 4.2 million. The four concepts were discussed as to the pros and cons of each site.

Shannon Snyder, Public Health Director and Phillip Nusser, Emergency Management Director met with the board to discuss the re-opening plan for Stafford County. The governor announced that there are no longer orders for the state, it is up to each county to have orders or make decisions. Commissioner Wycoff moved and Grimmatt seconded to continue following the governor's reopening plan with public gatherings restricted to 30 instead of 15 until phase 3 starts, which is June 8<sup>th</sup>, then moving to 50 people per gathering during phase 3. Motion carried 3-0.
